James Rudolph is a Geriatrician and Palliative Care Physician who works on developing, implementing, managing, and improving programs that meet the care needs of aging individuals with a focus on maintaining their independence in the community. He is a clinician, researcher, and educator. His area of expertise is the relationship of cognitive and physical functional deficits to negative health events in older persons, particularly those who are hospitalized.

Dr. Rudolph is one of the founding members of the American Delirium Society and a leading expert within the area of delirium. Delirium, a sudden alteration in mental status, is a serious complication in hospitalized patients that prolongs length of stay, increases the risk of death and might contribute to long-term brain dysfunction. Dr. Rudolph's numerous contributions have resulted in increased awareness of delirium across healthcare settings.
